UPDATES & INFORMATION

2026 CENSUS

2026 is a Census of Population year. Invitation letters will be sent in early May requesting Canadian households to complete the questionnaire online. Completing the census helps ensure your community receives its fair share. Municipalities receive annual Municipal Revenue Sharing Grant from the Province of Saskatchewan using calculation based on census populations. Your response helps ensure our community receives the funding, services, and infrastructure it needs.

Every resident counted brings dollars to our community.

TOWN OF PILOT BUTTE LEADERSHIP SCHOLARSHIP

The Town of Pilot Butte is offering one (1) \$1,000 scholarship to any Pilot Butte Grade 12 graduating student. The scholarship application will consist of an essay, video, and high school transcript submission, as well as an interview. Scholarship will be awarded upon a copy of an official tuition receipt from the post-secondary institution.

ELIGIBILITY

- ✔ Preference given to those attending a post-secondary institution in Saskatchewan within one (1) year of graduation.
- ✔ Students must be a resident of the Town of Pilot Butte.

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

- Submit a well-organized essay, including your contact information (e-mail, address & phone number). The essay needs to discuss:
 - Employment history, community and school volunteer work, extra-curricular and school activities. Please describe how your employment, volunteerism, & extra-curricular activities have provided a positive impact to youth leadership in the Pilot Butte.
 - What have been the benefits to growing up in rural/small-town Saskatchewan? What opportunities would you suggest that would make Pilot Butte a better place to live and work?
 - A short video on what youth leadership in a small town means to you.
- Submit a copy of your most recent high-school transcript.
- Submit with letter of reference.
- Attend the interview on the pre-determined date.

SUBMISSION INFORMATION

- Applications due by May 1, 2026
- Interviews will take place on a to-be-determined date.
- When applicants drop off or e-mail in their application forms, they will be assigned a time for an interview, which will be held in the Town Office Council Chambers.
- Please note: If no qualified applicant is found, the scholarship may not necessarily be awarded.





Spring Tips & Reminders

Pets

Reminder to Pet Owners:

• Pets must be licensed through the Town as per the Bylaw No.11-2017 Dog and Cat Control. The license fee is \$20 for neutered pets and \$40 for those not neutered for the lifetime of the pet. Licensing forms are available on the Town website: pilotbutte.ca/pets



- Pets must be on leash at all times when outside your fenced yard.
- Please clean up after your pets on public and private property. This includes parks, pathways and on your property to ensure the smell doesn't become a nuisance as the weather warms.
- Please be respectful of neighbours by ensuring dogs are not left outside barking continuously.

Street Cleaning

As the snow melts and the streets dry, street sweeping will take place throughout Town. Please watch the Town's social media, website & notification systems, such as **Voyent Alert**, for notification of planned street sweeping days so you can ensure your vehicle is not parked on the street during those times.

ATV Registration

All ATV's being operated on Town property must be registered and display a registration tag provided by the Town of Pilot Butte. ATV registrations must be renewed annually, the renewal fee is \$15 per plate.



From the Town

Utility Notices & Payments

Utilities are billed on the first business day of the month for the previous month's usage. Payments are due at the end of the billing month. Interest will be charged at the rate of 1.5% per month on unpaid balances. Please plan accordingly when making online payments, as it can take up to 3-5 days to be received and processed.



Payment Options:

- Cash - at the Town Office
- Credit Card - online through OptionPay at pilotbutte.ca/optionpay or at the Town Office (OptionPay fees apply)
- Debit at the Town Office
- Online banking as a bill payment
 - **E-Transfer is NOT a payment option for Utility payments

Property Taxes

The property tax year is from January 1st – December 31st of the current year.

Property tax notices are sent by the end of May and are due December 31st of the year in which the notice is issued. Any amount unpaid by December 31st will be carried forward to the new year and will be subject to a 1.5% penalty on the first of every month thereafter until paid. Discounts may be available for early payment- please refer to the discount information on the Tax Notice.



Recreation Center & nearby exterior areas limited access April 24-26, 2026

The Recreation Center & nearby exterior areas will be in-use with limited access to the public April 24-26 as they are booked by HD Scent Detection. This group will be hosting a dog sport scent detection competition, where people will be competing with their dogs sanctioned by the Sporting Detection Dogs Association. There will be about 35 dogs present for the competition and areas in use will be marked and barricaded during this time.



Book Review by Small Towns are the Life

PRIMAL by Mike Hintze

I read this book in the middle of the night on one of those occasions when I woke way too early and failed to find sleep again. The book didn't help, this is not a book that induces sleep. Yet, this isn't a book you can read half-asleep. There is a lot of action and a lot of detail. You need to be awake to follow the story. In his Foreword the author indicates that his work is influenced by classic monster tales. I admit to not having read any of the horror classics so I have no frame of reference, although my grandson had me read a book called Scythe which evoked in me the same feeling of unreality. The opening chapter seizes attention right at the outset, and the fast pace continues throughout. If Jack Reacher, Odd Thomas, Katniss Everdeen, Wolverine, Professor Lupus and Buck were blended into one creature, they might describe the protagonist in this story, Roland Fell. The story follows Roland's search for identity across time and continents as he accepts his condition, realizes his purpose and how to achieve it. While there is violence, gore, and betrayal there is also loyalty, courage and strength. The book is about survival and, one hopes, eventually, redemption? Characters come and go and the end of the book draws the reader into looking forward to the next chapters in the life of Roland. While the book is outside of my usual scope, I enjoyed it. Of particular interest, naturally, were the chapters closer to home. I won't be wandering around Regina in the dark anytime soon.

Keep writing, Mike. We want to see what happens next.



When financial conversations come up with families in Pilot Butte and nearby communities, they rarely start with investment returns or market forecasts. More often, the discussion begins with a simple question:

“Do we actually have things organized if something unexpected happens?”

Estate planning is something many people mean to deal with eventually. It often sits on the list of things to do “later,” alongside updating a will or organizing important documents. The assumption is that it becomes relevant closer to retirement.

In reality, estate planning is less about age and more about preparation. Its purpose is not simply to divide assets after someone passes away. At its heart, it is about making life a little easier for the people who may one day need to step in and make decisions. Without clear instructions, provincial legislation determines how an estate is handled.

Those rules outline how assets are distributed, who manages the estate, and in certain situations, how decisions are made regarding minor children. While these laws provide a framework, they may not always reflect what a family would have chosen for itself. That is why taking time to think about estate planning ahead of time can make such a difference.

The Basic Pieces of an Estate Plan

For most families, estate planning begins with a few important elements.

A will is typically the starting point. It outlines how assets should be distributed and identifies the person responsible for carrying out those wishes.

That person, known as the executor, plays an important role. They are responsible for organizing the estate, settling obligations, and filing the final tax return. Because this responsibility can be significant, it is worth choosing someone who is organized and dependable.

For parents, estate planning can also include guardianship instructions. These identify who should care for children if both parents are unable to do so.

Estate planning also considers situations that may arise during someone’s lifetime. Power of attorney documents allow a trusted individual to make financial or personal decisions if someone becomes unable to manage those responsibilities themselves.

Many families also take the opportunity to document final wishes, such as burial or cremation preferences. While these conversations are not always easy, they often bring comfort by removing uncertainty for loved ones later on.

The Financial Side Many People Don’t Expect

Estate planning is not only a legal matter. It also has financial implications.

Under Canadian tax rules, most assets are treated as though they were sold at fair market value on the date of death. This rule, known as deemed disposition, can create taxable gains if those assets have increased in value.

Registered accounts such as **RRSPs** or **RRIFs** may also become fully taxable unless they are transferred to an eligible spouse or dependent.

In addition, estates often go through probate, the legal process where the court validates the will and confirms the executor’s authority to administer the estate.

Understanding these elements helps families recognize that estate planning is closely connected to financial planning as well.

Three Practical Ideas to Keep in Mind

Every family’s situation is different, but a few simple ideas often guide the conversation.

#1 Clear instructions can ease stress for loved ones.

When decisions are documented, families spend less time navigating uncertainty.

#2 The people involved matter as much as the paperwork.

Executors, guardians, and powers of attorney carry meaningful responsibility.

#3 Estate planning works best when it connects with financial planning.

Taxes, account structures, and asset ownership can influence how smoothly an estate is settled.

Looking Ahead

Estate planning is ultimately about preparation.

For many families, the goal is not complexity. It is simply ensuring that important decisions are thought through ahead of time rather than left to chance.

Whether someone is early in their career, raising a family, or approaching retirement, taking time to review these questions can provide greater clarity for the future.

Financial confidence rarely comes from rushing decisions. More often, it grows from thoughtful conversations and steady planning over time.



