

UPDATES & INFORMATION

2026 CENSUS

2026 is a Census of Population year. Invitation letters will be sent in early May requesting Canadian households to complete the questionnaire online. Completing the census helps ensure your community receives its fair share. Municipalities receive annual Municipal Revenue Sharing Grant from the Province of Saskatchewan using calculation based on census populations. Your response helps ensure our community receives the funding, services, and infrastructure it needs.

PILOT BUTTE SHOWCASE

The Pilot Butte Town Council is hosting a Pilot Butte Showcase on February 5, 2026, to highlight our community and attract potential future residents, businesses, and investors, supporting continued growth and expansion. PROPERTY ASSESSMENTS

Property Assessment begins in February with SAMA (Saskatchewan Assessment Management Agency) assessing properties throughout Town that have recently had permits with work completed, or currently have open permits.

BUILDING PERMITS

A building permit is required when any structural change or alteration is made to an existing building, or when any new construction is undertaken. This includes but not limited to: Basement development, decks, detached garage, sheds over 100sq ft, swimming pool, etc.

View your Tax & Utility notices & balances online!

In February 2024, The Town implemented a new program for e-notices for taxes & utilities. Notifications of new notices available are sent by email, with a link to sign in to a secure website to view your current notice, payment receipts, utility and tax notices, as well as previous notices and current balances!

Drinking Water Quality and Compliance

The Water Security Agency and the Ministry of Environment requires that at least once each year waterworks owners provide notification to consumers of the quality of water produced and supplied as well as information on the performance of the waterworks in submitting samples as required by a Minister's Order or Permit to Operate a waterworks. The following is a summary of the **Town of Pilot Butte**'s water quality and sample submission compliance record for the **year of 2025**. This report was completed on **16-Jan-2026**. Readers should refer to Water Security Agency's "Municipal Drinking Water Quality Monitoring Guidelines, June 2015, EPB 502" for more information on minimum sample submission requirements. Permit requirements for a specific waterworks may require more sampling than outlined in the department's monitoring guidelines. The owner/operator is responsible to ensure that 100 per cent of all bacteriological samples are submitted as required. All waterworks are required to submit samples for bacteriological water quality; the frequency of monitoring depends on the population served by the waterworks.

A minimum of 0.1 milligrams per litre (mg/L) free chlorine residual OR 0.5 mg/L total chlorine residual is required at all times throughout the distribution system unless otherwise approved. A proper chlorine submission is defined as a bacteriological sample submission form with both the free and total chlorine residual fields filled out. An adequate chlorine is a result that indicates that the chlorine level is above the regulated minimums. An adequate chlorine may be counted even if the chlorine results were submitted incorrectly. A waterworks is required to submit chlorine residual test results on every bacteriological sample they submit.

A minimum of 0.1 milligrams per litre (mg/L) free chlorine residual is required for water entering the distribution system. Tests are normally performed on a daily basis by the waterworks operator and are to be recorded in operation records. This data includes the number of free chlorine residual tests performed, the overall range of free chlorine residual (highest and lowest recorded values) and the number of tests and percentage of results not meeting the minimum requirement of 0.1 mg/L free chlorine residual.

Turbidity is a measure of water treatment efficiency. Turbidity measures the "clarity" of the drinking water and is generally reported in Nephelometric Turbidity Units (NTU). All waterworks are required to monitor turbidity at the water treatment plant. The frequency of measurement varies from daily for small systems to continuous for larger waterworks.

Substances within the chemical health category may be naturally occurring in drinking water sources or may be the result of human activities. These substances may represent a long-term health risk if the Maximum Acceptable Concentration (MAC) or Interim Maximum Acceptable Concentration (IMAC) is exceeded. All drinking water supplies are required to monitor for substances in the Chemical-Health category, the frequency of monitoring depends on the population served by the waterworks. Some waterworks will add fluoride to drinking water as a means to aid in the prevention of dental decay.

All waterworks serving less than 5000 persons are required to submit water samples for SE's General Chemical category once every two years if a ground water source or once per three months every second year if a surface water or blended surface/groundwater source. The General Chemical category includes analysis for alkalinity, bicarbonate, calcium, carbonate, chloride, conductivity, hardness (as CaCO_3), magnesium, sodium, sulphate and total dissolved solids.

The last sample for General Chemical analysis was submitted on **3-Feb-2025**. Sample results indicated that there were no exceedances of the provincial aesthetic objectives for the General Chemical category.

*Objectives apply to certain characteristics of or substances found in water for human consumptive or hygienic use. The presence of these substances will affect the acceptance of water by consumers and/or interfere with the practice of supplying good quality water. Compliance with drinking water aesthetic objectives is not mandatory as these objectives are in the range where they do not constitute a health hazards. The aesthetic objectives for several parameters (including hardness as CaCO_3 , magnesium, sodium and total dissolved solids) consider regional differences in drinking water sources and quality.

Town of Pilot Butte ATV Registration

What You Need To Know...

- All ATV's being operated on town property must be registered & display a registration tag provided by the Town of Pilot Butte.
- Golf Carts are *NOT* permitted.
- Use of the travelled portion of the roadway is permitted at a maximum of 30km/h within town limits.
- The Town recommends residents use the paved streets when accessing the most direct route to and from place of residence.
- Riders must be 16 years of age and hold a valid driver's license OR
- Riders age 12-15 must be directly supervised by an adult, or hold a valid ATV course certificate.
- All Terrain Vehicles are *NOT* permitted at any time on Town of Pilot Butte Public Reserve land (Parks), buffer strips, walkways, and crown owned land.
- Please follow and obey all posted signs.
- Please respect our residents and their right to quiet enjoyment of their property.
- To register your ATV please visit the Town of Pilot Butte's website: pilotbutte.ca/atv-registration
- The annual renewal fee is \$15 per plate. You must submit current proof of liability insurance with your payment.

Property taxes, heating, food, vehicle expenses, and healthcare do not stay still. Inflation quietly pressure-tests every assumption in a retirement plan. Income that doesn't grow may feel stable at first, then gradually become restrictive.

Without growth built into the plan, inflation doesn't need to be dramatic to be damaging. It only needs time. This is where planning with an inflation lens becomes essential.

The goal is not aggressive investing or chasing returns. **The goal is resilience. Long-term growth, thoughtfully diversified across assets and strategies, is what helps protect purchasing power over decades.**

The difference isn't in resources — it's in design.

Nothing changes except the model: the same doctor, the same patient, an ECG machine, and an operator. Yet the outcome — for the patient, the doctor, and the healthcare system — is completely transformed.

Scenario 1: The Current Primary Care Model

Patient Experience

- A man experiences chest tightness and visits his family doctor.
- The doctor assesses him and writes a requisition for an ECG.
- The patient travels across town to a diagnostic centre and waits in line for testing.

- The patient then books a follow-up appointment, often one to two weeks later, to review the results.

Patient Experience

- The same man experiences chest tightness and visits his doctor's clinic.
- He is greeted by a **Clinical Paramedic** who takes his history, vital signs, and immediately performs an ECG in the clinic.
- The results are handed directly to the doctor, who reviews them with the patient on the spot.
- Any necessary treatment or referral happens immediately — before the patient leaves.
- This transaction could be measured in minutes, not weeks.






