In 2025 the Snow and Ice Control Policy was updated in February 2025 to provide additional information on the snow and ice removal process and procedure, responsibilities and an updated map. Below is information from the policy outlining the responsibilities of the Town and Residents.

## RESPONSIBILITIES

### Town Responsibilities

1. Town Council is responsible for the approval of the established priority areas, the level of service of this Policy and for providing an adequate budget to meeting these priorities and service levels.
2. The Director of Public Works is responsible for the establishment of the priority areas and the level of service of this Policy, and the strategic planning of the Public Works Department.
3. The Public Works Manager is responsible for the operations and planning of the Public Works Operators.
4. The Public Works Department is responsible for performing snow removal to the level of service described in this Policy and for providing feedback on the effectiveness of the Policy.

### Resident Responsibilities.

1. Property owners are responsible for the snow removal on their private property and on the sidewalk adjacent to their property. Private snow removal should be carried out in such a way as to not negatively impact other property owners or hinder the Town's snow removal efforts.
2. Snow and ice placed on municipal streets, sidewalks, pathways, or parking lots by individuals or companies is prohibited.
3. Covering or blocking fire hydrants with snow is prohibited.
4. Vehicles in regular daily use may be parked on the streets for up to 72 hours. Residents are encouraged to avoid all on-street parking during/after a snow event.
5. Vehicles, trailers and any other items stored or otherwise parked are prohibited from parking on boulevards from November 1st to April 30th.
6. Residents are encouraged to use flexible driveway marks to mark their driveways and yards. Materials such as rebar, cinder blocks, rocks, concrete blocks or any other immovable material is prohibited.





**The Outdoor Rink is open for the 2025/2026 season as of December 29th!**

## Outdoor Rink Care & Maintenance

- The lights are on daily 5:30pm – 10:00pm
- The warm up shack is open:  
Weekdays 9:00am – 10:00pm  
Weekends 9:00am – 10:00pm
- \*To promote safe outdoor activities, the warm up shack will NOT be open if the temperature is -27°C or below.
- The ice maintenance will be done on weekdays. The Zamboni floods on the outdoor rink will occur once weekly every Monday. Shovels are available in the shack for residents to clear the ice as needed on weekends

## Outdoor Rink Rules

- Use the rink at your own risk
- Helmets are mandatory for children under 12 years of age and strongly recommended for anyone older
- No food, drinks, or glass containers on the ice surface
- No smoking or vaping inside the warm up shack or outdoor rink
- Stay off the ice during maintenance (flooding or snow removal by facility staff)
- Report any hazards or damage to facility staff
- Do not chip or dig into the ice with sticks, skates, or shovels
- Please be respectful of all rink users and share the ice safely and fairly

## SNOWSHOE BORROWING PROGRAM

With beautiful landscape and countryside near by, such as the White Butte Trails, this is a great way to get outside, explore and enjoy the outdoors!

### Information:

- Snowshoes can be borrowed on a daily or weekend basis.
- There is no charge to borrow snowshoe equipment, but credit card authorization must be provided for the borrowed equipment.
- Snowshoe sizes and quantities available are:
  - Small - Up to 68 Kg (150 lb) - 2 sets available
  - Medium - Up to 90 Kg (200 lb) - 2 sets available
  - Large - Up to 113 Kg (250 lb) - 2 sets available

### How to borrow:

- Snowshoe equipment must be pre-booked. Please contact the Recreation Program Coordinator at 306-781-6253 or Director of Recreation 306-781-3402, visit the Recreation Office or complete the form below to submit a request. Our Recreation Department will reach out to confirm availability and provide a Snowshoe Borrowing Agreement for you to complete the booking.
